The Center presents a dynamic calendar of performances each season, featuring music, dance, theater, comedy, and film. Audiences have experienced unforgettable nights with renowned artists like Renée Fleming, Audra McDonald, Leslie Odom, Jr., and Brian Stokes Mitchell, laughed along with comedians like Jay Leno, Kevin James, and Wanda Sykes, and witnessed awe-inspiring performances by groups like the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater and the Emerson String Quartet. On the cinematic side, the Stony Brook Film Festival has welcomed acclaimed filmmakers and actors such as Alan Alda, Tilda Swinton, Brian Cox, Ralph Macchio, and many others, alongside a diverse slate of international directors making their World or U.S. premieres. Whether it's a solo violin recital, a night of stand-up comedy, or a powerful

At the core of the Center's identity is a commitment to accessibility and community engagement. Ticket prices are kept affordable, student and youth outreach programs bring the arts to new generations, and local residents are invited to feel ownership of this one-of-a-kind resource. The Center is not just for the university—it's for everyone.

One of Staller's most celebrated events is the Stony Brook Film Festival, held each July. For ten days, the festival transforms the main stage into a cinematic showcase, drawing filmmakers and audiences from around the world. These are films you

Community engagement is at the core of the Staller Center for the Arts, especially when it comes to inspiring young audiences on Long Island.

One of its most impactful initiatives is the Instrument Petting Zoo (IPZ)—a free, hands-on program introducing children ages 3–8 to orchestral instruments. Since launching in 2015, the IPZ has reached thousands of children through visits to schools, libraries, Head Start classrooms, hospitals, and nonprofits. Many participants are encountering instruments like the cello or trombone for the very first time.

With help from Stony Brook University music students and faculty, the program offers more than just a musical experience—it fosters connection and



curiosity. Visits to places like Stony Brook Children's Hospital highlight the emotional impact of this work, as children light up at the chance to engage with live instruments in an interactive setting.

The IPZ also supports university students by offering paid teaching experience that strengthens their skills in leadership, communication, and outreach—preparing many for careers in music education.

In parallel, Staller's "Seats for Students" and "Films for Students" initiatives offer Stony Brook students free or low-cost access to global performing arts and cinema. These programs remove financial barriers, allowing students to engage with diverse cultures and high class performances.

Together, these efforts underscore Staller's commitment to keeping the arts accessible, meaningful, and alive for all ages.





Broadway megastars Kelli **O'Hara and Sutton Foster** were the last live performance at the Staller Center before it shut down with the rest of the country during the Pandemic? On stage, a cup of water was placed for each of the Broadway stars. Tony awardwinner Kelli O'Hara took the stage first and started off with a small joke. "No one drank out of my cup right?" O'Hara asked. "Thank you all for coming out tonight. This may be our last gathering." And it was. The next live performance for the Staller Center wasn't until the following Fall of 2021, nearly two years later. The Center continued through the pandemic offering digital outreach programs for children stuck at home and remained successful even with the massive undertaking of creating a virtual live Film Festival.
